# Guthrie History

## Learning and Education.



Dr. Donald Guthrie was the founder of The Guthrie Clinic and chief of staff at Robert Packer Hospital in Sayre from January 10, 1910, to October 30, 1958. During Dr. Guthrie's 48 years at the helm, he led the transformation of a small country hospital into a major medical center and clinic.

Academics are a distinguishing characteristic of the Guthrie organization, dating back to 1901 when the School of Nursing was founded. The Donald Guthrie Research Foundation formed in 1942 and, with funds from the Emily Guthrie Estate, the Guthrie Research Institute formed in 1980.

Guthrie's commitment to learning and education includes the Internal Medicine Residency program accredited in 1958, General Surgery Residency program accredited in 1959, and the Family Medicine Residency program accredited in 1993, as well as a fellowship in Cardiology accredited in 2009 and a Pharmacy Residency in 2017. In 2019, the institution was pleased to relaunch a Gastroenterology Fellowship and introduce an Emergency Medicine Residency. A new Pulmonary Disease and Critical Care Medicine Fellowship will also welcome its first fellows in 2020.

Today, one of the longest established group practices in the country, Guthrie has more than 295 primary and specialty care physicians and 175 advance practice practitioners and has more than 1 million patient visits each year in 45 regional offices and five hospitals in Pennsylvania and New York. Guthrie's commitment to its core values of patient-centeredness, teamwork and excellence—the defining values upon which The Guthrie Clinic was founded—remains robust and unchanging.

## Becoming A Leader

### Hands-on experience with a diverse case mix at a state-of-the-art facility.

PGY1 pharmacy residents at Guthrie Robert Packer Hospital take on the role of clinical pharmacists and provide care to patients in a variety of patient-care settings under the guidance of skilled preceptors. Guthrie Robert Packer Hospital is a community teaching hospital licensed for approximately 254 acute care beds where pharmacy department members are an important member of the health care team. Residents grow exponentially in their clinical skills with direct engagement in patient care, teaching, project management, medication use policy and evaluation. Leadership opportunities exist within the training program. The program places an emphasis on the provision of pharmaceutical care in many patient-care areas and teaching health care practitioners.



Upon completion, residents will be self-directed learners possessing clinical competence, leadership and professional skills while exhibiting the confidence to excel in diverse practice environments.
