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About Providence Cedars-Sinai Tarzana Medical Center

Providence Cedars-Sinai Tarzana Medical Center (PCSTMC) is a non-profit community hospital with 250 licensed beds that has been serving the San Fernando Valley communities since 1973. In addition to heart, vascular, orthopedic, cancer, pediatric and women's services, we house the largest Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in the area and our emergency department is a designated STEMI and stroke receiving center. The pharmacy department provides 24-hour care and offers a broad range of clinical services including: Antimicrobial Stewardship, TPN & pharmacokinetic consults, anticoagulation monitoring, and Transition of Care activities.

How to Apply

Providence Cedars-Sinai Tarzana Medical Center participates in the ASHP PhORCAS and the ASHP MATCH program. Applicants must submit all application documents through PhORCAS by January 2. This includes:

- Letter of intent
- A brief essay describing the following:
 - ◆ How will PCSTMC's residency program help further your professional goals?
 - ◆ As a prospective resident, how can you contribute to PCSTMC's program?
- Official transcripts from College of Pharmacy
- Curriculum Vitae
- Three letters of recommendation (at least one from a faculty member and one from employer)

Personal interviews will be scheduled from the end of January through end of February. Selected applicants will be notified of their interview times via email.

Residency Requirements

The resident must possess a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from an accredited college of pharmacy and have a California intern license prior to beginning the program on July 1. It is expected that the resident will be a licensed pharmacist in the state of within 90 days after the start of residency.

Residents will be required to staff a minimum of 15 variable shifts throughout the residency year. Staffing schedule will ensure that residents maintain four days off per pay period. Residents will also be expected to precept fourth year APPE students and attend interdisciplinary rounds.

Compensation and Benefits

Compensation for the first year of residency is approximately \$60,000. Benefits include full medical, dental and vision coverage as well as 14 days of vacation. Resident accommodations include their own work area and travel and registration reimbursements for residency-related conferences.
